



**Core words: IN, ON,
OUT, LIKE



Phrases that can be modeled with the core words: IN/ON/OUT: Put it in, Take it out, Is it in? Is it out? Ask your child to find the words on the core vocabulary board or on their device.

Activities that will target core vocabulary words "in/out": Hide and make Gingerbread people.



Core Words to Model: LIKE, DO, NOT, WANT, FINISHED, MORE

Procedure: Allow students to try various foods. After trying them, model LIKE or DO NOT LIKE. Students can share if they WANT MORE or are FINISHED.
